The Handbook of Research on Service-Learning Initiatives in Teacher Education Programs provides emerging research on the methods and techniques for educators to strengthen their knowledge regarding the intersection of service learning and field placements. While highlighting topics, such as cultural competency, teacher development, and multicultural education, this book explores the benefits, challenges, and opportunities for employing community service as the driving framework for field experiences. This publication is a vital resource for practitioners, educators, faculty, and administrators seeking current research on the opportunity of field involvement to enhance teacher candidates ' experiences and provide a channel for meaningful learning.

January 2009 marked the 25th anniversary of one of the most famous three minutes of television history. The third edition of the Handbook of Educational Psychology is sponsored by Division 15 of the American Psychological Association.
